## RULES - PROCEDURES – GRADING

### CLASS PROCEDURES AND RULES:

1. Promptness: Be on time. Students are expected to be in their assigned seat, ready to begin by the beginning bell. School policy will be enforced regarding lateness to class.
2. Self-Discipline: No talking while someone is presenting/teaching. Raise your hand. Do not touch band equipment.
3. Be Neat: Pick up around you. Replace chairs and stands to their original locations.
4. Gum and Food: are not allowed in the band room.
5. Damaged equipment: You are held responsible for any equipment intentionally damaged. This includes music stands and percussion equipment.
6. Be Prepared: Bring all materials to class. Students are to have a notebook, writing utensil, and folder or binder to organize all handouts.
7. Cell Phones and Technology: Students are not to use cell phones or other personal devices during class without explicit permission from the teacher. School policy will be enforced regarding all technology items.

### GRADING:

Your grade will be broken down as follows:

Participation in class – 100 points per quarter

Worksheets and quizzes – 10-30 points each

Projects and tests – 50-100 points each

For your research project, you will be asked to teach a three day unit on a music topic of your choice. A list of approved topics will be made available, or you may submit a proposal to Mrs. Wolf for a topic not on the list. You will be responsible for researching the topic, creating materials and handouts for the class, creating worksheets, and your project will culminate with a quiz on the topic that the class will take. Your project grade will be based on the quality and accuracy of your research, the quality of your in class presentations, and how much the class learns about your topic. More information on this project will be given in a separate handout.
